I. MEDICAL WOMEN'S INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION

1. PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Professor Afua Hesse, Ghana

These are troubling times we live in. A commentator made a remark that it would appear that the spiritual consciousness of people in various countries around the world have been awakened to rise up against forms of governance that are not seen as democratic, resulting in the loss of lives we have all been privy to here in our living rooms through the medium of television, internet and other forms of electronic communications. As Medical women, we are well aware that in all of these, it is women and children who bear the brunt of the difficult aftermath of these conflicts. We all held our breath to hear from our Egyptian colleagues, who, in the middle of planning a regional Congress for 2012, suddenly found themselves in the middle of internal conflicts. Thankfully we have heard from them and they are well. We are grateful for the speedy resolution though as elsewhere, we deplore the loss of lives and encourage them to continue the planning of what will no doubt be a very successful Regional Congress. I urge you all to put the dates on your calendars in solidarity with our Egyptian colleagues.

Congratulations to our many members in various parts of the world who are being recognized and receiving honours for their various contribution to the advancement of health in their countries and internationally. We applaud their efforts and encourage everyone to send in the record of their achievements.

Let us not forget that our call for this triennium is "Moving beyond the rhetoric to action-Improving the health of women and children." This is a call in line with the Millennium Development Goals (MDG), whose deadline of 2015 is just around the corner. There never is enough time but National Associations should heed this call and MWIA asks that they keep the Secretariat well informed of their activities as they plan and execute programs.

The United Nations on Thursday 24th February, 2010, launched the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women, known as UN Women under the aegis of the Secretary- General of the UN himself, Mr. Ban Ki-Moon, who worked so hard to see this dream become a reality. This was on the occasion of the 55th session of the Commission on the Status of Women which was held at the UN in New York. It was a time of renewed commitment to addressing issues of women and girls through a joint effort of the UN agencies that were hitherto separate, namely Division for the Advancement of Women (DAW), International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women (INSTRAW), Office of the Special Adviser on Gender Issues and Advancement of Women (OSAGI), and the United Nations Development Fund for Women (UNIFEM) under one canopy with Dr. Michelle Bachelet, former President of Chile as the new Executive Director. This is an effort to open up the spaces for women in all spheres and to engage these collective voices so as to impact in a real and sustained manner an improvement in the collective lives and livelihoods of women and families,

harnessing the multiple talents of women. Some members of your Executive, who attended the CSW, had the privilege of meeting her in person as she held a private meeting with us arranged through the efforts of your hardworking Vice-President for South America, Dr Mercedes Viteri (see attached photograph). They were, Prof. Afua Hesse, Dr. Shelley Ross, Dr. Claudia Morrissey, Dr Satty Keswani, Dr Padmini Murthy and Dr Eleanor Nwadinobi.



Dr Bachelet identified very keenly with us as Medical women and indeed it was obvious that her viewpoint is progressive precisely because she is a medical woman. She spoke of her aim of bringing synergies and coordination and that the UN women would not usurp the role of any one of the individual organizations in their areas of expertise. She reminded us that globally, the emphasis on reproductive health although necessary, had led to a loss of emphasis in addressing issues of women's health. She would work in the area of advocacy mainstreaming and championing women's health as a whole. She reechoed the call to action rather than words and identified strongly with the MWIA triennial call of moving beyond the rhetoric into action. She emphasized the need to document success stories especially in South to South cooperation, paying attention to specific cultural touches and biases and suggesting that approaching women's health issues from the point of view of opportunity costs of not intervening might get the required attention and funding commitments of governments.

The Executive members also took the opportunity to meet up with the new Executive Director of the UNFPA who is Dr Babatunde Oshotimehin, who had previously been in charge of Nigeria's HIV program as well as served as the Minister for Health of Nigeria. This was through the efforts and hard work of the MWIA UN representatives in New

York, Drs Satty Keswani and Padmini Murthy and we do appreciate their dedication. Dr Eleanor Nwadinobi, Chair of Finance, and I had worked with Dr. Oshotimehin in other

previous capacities.



MWIA has collaborated with the UNFPA in the past and we were seeking to renew that commitment. This was a very successful meeting and I believe further pages in the chapter of collaboration with UNFPA will be opening shortly. Several issues were raised among which is the key most issue of mentoring which we can and should easily promote. I believe we can all work on this and MWIA will be in touch with your National Associations through your Vice-Presidents to stimulate us on this through an initial situational analysis on this and other topics.

MWIA held a well attended parallel event at the Commission on the Status of Women, which was very well organized by our UN representatives, Drs. Keswani and Murthy. The theme was "Medicine- the Pink Collar Profession" and was addressed by a panel of both your executive who were in New York and other members of MWIA from the American Medical Women's Association (AMWA) as well as Mary Singletary from the American National Council of Women. The panel included Dr Gail Beck and Dr Mercedes Viteri who were unavoidably unable to attend the other meetings.
